Submission of manuscripts

Please note that your contribution should contain between 4.500 and 7.000 words including the bibliography.

Spelling

Spelling follows the *Oxford English Dictionary* or the *Concise Oxford Dictionary*. If there is a choice we prefer the endings -ize and -ization as opposed to -ise or -isation.

Headings and Subheadings

Authors may use up to four levels of headings. All nouns, verbs and adjectives should begin with capital letters.

Referencing

Please use the styleguide of the journal. Please use in-text citation between parentheses: name of the author, year of publication and, if applicable, page number. E.g.:

- (Elkington, 1999: 15)
- (Allen and Qian, 2005; Bennet *et al.*, 1999)
- (Rousseau, 1998a; 1998b).

A complete alphabetical list of references should be added at the end of the article. Referencing style in the bibliography should be as follows:

Book titles by a single author:

- Deutsch, M. (1973). *The resolution of conflicts: Constructive and destructive processes*. New Haven: Yale University Press.
- Kelman, H. (1996). The interactive problem-solving approach. In C. Crocker & F. Hampson (Eds.), *Mediation in international relations* (pp. 191-237). London: Macmillan.

Book titles by two or more authors:

- Alfini, J., Press, S.B., Sternlight, J. & Stulberg, J. (2006). *Mediation theory and practice*. Los Angeles, CA: LexisNexis.

Articles in a journal:

- Avruch, K. & Black, P. (1987). A 'generic' theory of conflict resolution: A critique. *Negotiation Journal*, 3(1), 87-96.

Citations

Please use double quotation marks for citations.

Length of quotation

Quotations of less than 30 words are to be included in the main text, between double quotation marks. Larger quotations begin on a new line, with a white line above and below to separate them from the text; it should be indented left and right; should be in small type; and it should not be placed between quotation marks.

Quote within a quote

Use single quotation marks for a quote within a quote.

Figures and tables

Figures and tables should always be numbered consecutively and need to have a title. Please always refer to the number of the table or figure in the text.

Abstract, keywords and affiliation

Authors are further requested to submit a short abstract of the article, keywords and their affiliation together with

their article. This information will also feature on our website.

Abstract

An abstract is a short summary of the article that can be read separately. The abstract consists of a maximum of 200 words. The abstract can be used to draft a press release.

Keywords

We would like to receive five keywords that give an overview of the article. Use the most relevant keywords from your article.
